

June 18, 1908 Mrs. W. L. HUCKEBY died at her home at Cleveland on June 11. She was born in Cloverport, Kentucky on January 1, 1843, was baptized into the Baptist Church on March 17, 1861, was married to William L. HUCKEBY on November 23, 1870 and moved to Florida in 1882. Her husband died several years ago. She leaves two grown sons, E. B. and D. H., both reside at Cleveland.

July 2, 1908 Mr. Jordan L. HOWELL, 84 years old, died here at the home of his son-in-law, Frank R. BLOUNT, last Friday and was buried in Bartow beside his wife the following day. He was from Columbus, Georgia where he served the city as treasurer and tax collector. He was married in 1846 to Miss Elizabeth S. JOHNSON who died in 1895. Three sons and three daughters survive. Two of the daughters live in Florida, Mrs. BLOUNT here and Mrs. F. S. HALL at Ormond Beach.

July 9, 1908 Robert J. WATERSON died at his home near Charlotte Harbor last Sunday. The deceased had been a Methodist since 1885. He was born in Levy County, April 4, 1859. He came to De Soto County fourteen years ago locating at Charlotte Harbor. He leaves a widow, a daughter and two sons.

August 6, 1908 Col. James Henry OCHILTREE died in Tampa on July 30, age 72 years. He was from a Scottish family though he was born in County Armagh, Ireland on January 11, 1836. When 16 years old he moved with his parents to Canada where he lived until the Civil War began. On June 26th, 1861, he enlisted in the 22nd Regiment of Illinois Volunteers. He spent six months in Libby prison. He continued to serve in the Army and on December 30, 1887, he was appointed orderly sergeant from Fort Riley, Kansas and ordered to Key West. There he married a daughter of Capt. Robert WHITEHEAD. He was placed on the retired list March 2, 1892 and two years later moved to Punta Gorda. His children were Anna, Robert and Sara who died in 1902.

October 8, 1908 Capt. J. A. ROBERTS died at the Soldier's Home in Jacksonville on September 30. He was born in Hamilton, Munroe County, Mississippi, April 7, 1835. He married Miss Julia C. BOOTH in October 1866. He served in the Confederate Army. He became a Presbyterian over 28 years ago. He moved to Sumterville in this state and lived in Jacksonville, Tampa, Fort Myers and Punta Gorda. He engaged in the hotel business. He leaves a widow and two sons, William A. ROBERTS of Punta Gorda and Raymond ROBERTS of Jacksonville. The widow and son Raymond live at No. 7 West Church Street, Jacksonville.

Solomon C. (Uncle Sol) PHILLIPS died Tuesday. He was born in Carteret County, North Carolina, January 22, 1837. He was a ship carpenter. In 1890, he came to Punta Gorda. He married 45 years ago to Miss Nancy DAVIS and they had four sons and a daughter. Mrs. PHILLIPS died in North Carolina, a son Jasper died in the Philippines seven years ago. The other children are Walter PHILLIPS of this city, Owen at Fort Myers, S. C. PHILLIPS, Jr. of Miami and Mrs. C. A. WADE of Fort Myers. He also leaves a widowed sister, Mrs. Ellen FULCHER, who had been living with him.

November 5, 1908 Dr. W. A. ROBERTS died on November 1. Born at Hamilton, Mississippi, November 21, 1867, Dr. ROBERTS moved to Vaiden, Mississippi, where he resided until 1885 when he came to Florida locating first at Sumterville. He came to Punta Gorda on Nov. 3, 1892 to engage in business for himself. He was married in this City on
