WILLIAM HENDERSON ADDISON 1823-c1897

William Henderson Addison was born in 1823 in Bladen County, North Carolina, son of John & Ellen Addison. His parents moved to north Florida about 1825/26 settling near Tallahassee in Leon County. During the Seminole Indian Wars, William served as a Private in Capt. Elijah Johnson's Company in 7th Regiment of Florida Militia commanded by Col. C. H. Davenport. He volunteered at Tallahassee on August 7, 1838 and was honorably discharged on September 7, 1838. His father was also a Private in this company. William also served in Capt. Thomas M. Grigsby's Company of Florida Militia. He volunteered at Tallahassee on November 20, 1839 and was honorably discharged at Fort Grigsby on
