

ANDREW B. ALBRITTON 1838-1889

Andrew B. Albritton was born in 1838 in Ware County, Georgia the youngest son of Thomas Albritton and his second wife, Rhoda (Strickland) Parker Albritton (a cousin of his first wife, Mary Strickland). Andrew's father, Thomas Albritton, was Justice of the Peace during his younger years.

The Thomas Albritton family lived near Capt. James Jones in the 590th District, Ware County (now in Brantley County, Georgia). This is near the High Bluff Church which still exist today.

In 1849 Capt. Jones' first wife, Sarah Mizell, died and he married Andrew's older sister, Jane Albritton. About the same time Andrew's older brother, Mathew R. W. Albritton married Civility Jones. Then on January 24, 1855 Andrew found another Georgia peach in the Jones family and married Nancy Jones. She was born June 16, 1834. Children of Andrew B. and Nancy (Jones) Albritton:

9. Francis Albritton, born Jan. 1871; married Robert L. Walker on August 10, 1889.
10. Sinie Albritton, born Jan. 1873; married Abner Van Buren Coker on April 7, 1891.
11. William Carroll Albritton, born March 20, 1875; married Harriet Elizabeth Walker on April 27, 1898.

On September 2, 1862 Andrew enlisted in the Confederate Army, Co. D, 7th Regiment, Pearce County, Georgia. He was honorably discharged in April of 1865 at the close of the war. After discharge, Andrew and family moved to Polk County, Florida, December 1, 1866.
